CHAIRMAN'S REPORT - Jonathan Douglas-Hughes OBE DL

I am happy to report that 2023 has been a year of not only re-establishing pre-covid attendance of young people at our county and national events and increased regular attendance but also the launching of new events and opportunities for young people.

This is largely due to the expertise and hard work of the team under the leadership of Martin Solder. As a result of years of development Essex is one of the most successful counties for numbers of affiliated clubs (130), the number of events and competitions for young people both here and at our adventure centres in Wales and Cumbria and extensive training for volunteers who carry out such good work in our affiliated clubs.

We look forward to an ever more successful year in 2024.

DIRECTOR'S REPORT - Martin Solder

Now in my 34th year of being County Director I occasionally look back at the past to reflect on our work to see what lessons can be learnt and occasionally ponder how EBGC has grown. Many of the elements of EBGC remain the same as when I started in 1989. The Chairman and several of the trustees are constants, many of our core clubs are still with us and we have people that were running clubs in 1989 still running them now. The need for our work remains the same, in fact it is increasing. The activities we provide are pretty much the same and the aim of the organisation is exactly the same as when I started, which is to develop young people to enable them to reach their full potential as adults.

So what's different if anything? The numbers of young people attending clubs has grown immeasurably. The numbers of clubs have grown. Our programme is bigger than it ever has been and now encompasses the arts as well as sport. We are doing all the same activities as we did in 1989 and then some. Our staff team is much bigger than it was. We are running and providing 3 outdoor centres for our clubs and young people. We provide a much bigger training programme for leaders and members now than we did. Through funding from the Jack Petchey Foundation we are able to provide nearly 500 places on holiday residential programmes. The Holiday and Food Activity Fund enables us to provide specific programmes for young people in holiday periods ensuring that they get activity and food. In 1989 I dreamt of having a minibus to take groups away. Now we have a fleet of 5 minibuses and other vehicles to move groups around. The need to generate income and funds is radically different now. We are now running school based projects as well as club based youthwork. Our national organisation is much smaller than it used to be, but their programme and opportunities remain the same and we are heavily linked with the World Federation of Youth Clubs and international youthwork in Nepal and the USA is high on our agenda.

Throughout this review you will see the plethora of work that we are undertaking across the whole of Essex, Southend and Thurrock and examples of the above. It is clear to me that there is a much greater need today than ever before. Young peoples pathway through life is not as clear as it once was. Anxiety, worry and mental health are not topics that featured greatly in the past. They do now. The mobile phone and covid effects are still a constant negative influence on young people and joining a club where you can engage with your peers in a positive, healthy, environment, where you have skilled and positive adult support can only be good for their development.

None of our organisations and ourselves can do this without funds and we are extremely grateful to our financial supporters, many of whom have been supporting us for 30 years plus. Also, and equally as valuable, are the volunteers that work with EBGC and across all our clubs. There are well over 1500 volunteers regularly devoting their time to work in clubs and who are supporting and working with young people. Nearly all the EBGC youthwork carried out across our network is carried out by volunteers and without them none of our clubs work would be able to take place. When I hear that society has become egocentric I find it difficult to recognise this across our network because of the sheer selflessness of thousands of people in all sorts of ways.

2023 has been another good year for EBGC and we are hoping that 2024 and beyond is even better and with your help and support there is no reason why it should not be. Many thanks to everyone who has supported EBGC, one of our programmes or one of our clubs over the last year. Long may it continue.


World Federation Of Youth Clubs - International Conference

NCS - National Citizen Service

With NCS looking to reach more young people in different ways, the summer of 2023 saw EBGC launch the new NCS Community Experiences across Essex. These new experiences focus on providing young people aged 15-17 (up to 25 with SEND) with opportunities to meet new people, develop their skills for independent living and employment and make a positive difference through social action. The new experiences take place in the young people's local communities and are completely free of charge to all of the young people taking part.

Over the course of the autumn & winter period our team has delivered almost 20 different experiences in partnership with local schools, colleges and affiliated members of the club network with more than 400 individual young people benefitting as a result.

Summer & Autumn 2024 will see the launch of more new experiences and we still have capacity to offer even more opportunities, if you have a group of young people aged 15-17 who may benefit from a bespoke NCS experience or would like to find out more about these opportunities, please contact the NCS team on ncs@essexboysandgirlsclubs.org or call the office on 01245 264783.

Transform our World

In 2023 EBGC established a new partnership with Global Action Plan to deliver Transform our World activities across Essex. In partnership with the #iWill fund, Department for Culture Media and Sport and National Lottery Community Fund, Transform our World is a multi-session activity programme that supports young people aged 10+ to consider what is important to them, how they can make a positive difference to the world around them as well as providing the opportunity to plan and deliver their own youth-led social action project. Transform our World is fully funded so has no cost to young people, schools or clubs taking part.














Young people initially attend our Activity Days at Layer Marney Outdoors, taking part in a variety of activities including Bush Craft, Raft Building, Team Challenges and Woodland Challenges.

A positive mindset and attitude, an appetite for teamwork, good listening skills and a willingness to learn, earned half of the participants the opportunity to attend a Life Skills Course over an 8-week period where they learnt about teamwork, communication, peer pressure, anger management and drug awareness in preparation for the week away.

During the weeks away they were challenged by some of the biggest mountains in England and Wales including the Brecon Beacons Horseshoe in South Wales and Blencathra, and Skiddaw in the Lake District.

They also used all the survival skills they had learnt by going on a 24-hour expedition and wild camp in wet and cold conditions and cooking ration packs on Trangia's, small, methylated spirit stoves.

Shortly after their return they are given the opportunity to share their experiences and achievements with parents, school and VIP's at Presentation evenings celebrating each and everyone's success and a positive outcome was their attendance at the JPF Residential Trips to Maes Y Lade during the following school holidays.

A message from Maes y lade - Assistant Director David Hassard

2023 saw our busiest year to date at Maes y Lade and during the school holidays we were able to welcome even more young people from within the EBGC network thanks to the continued support from the Jack Petchey Foundation, Essex Youth Trust and Essex Educational Task Force. 477 young people took part in the 5 day activity programme that enables young people from Essex to get into Mountains, Gorges, Crags, Caves and Rivers that our residential centres have on their door steps. A massive thank you to all the club leaders and helpers who gave up their time and sleep so their club members had the opportunity to take part! These club based residentials have formed part of the wider programme at Maes y Lade alongside the usual mix of Schools, Princes Trust Groups, Respect Projects, Duke of Edinburgh, a local Outdoor Club for young people that live nearby to the Centre and new for 2023 Scottish Canoe expeditions.

I think it has become even more critical over the past few years for young people to have the chance to take part in residential outdoor experiences. This importance can be evidenced by the Outdoor Education bills moving through the legislation stages in both Wales and Scotland at the time of writing in order to guarantee young people the right to an Outdoor Residential as part of their formal education. We are also working with Tim Farron MP to do the same in England. These bills may or may not become law, but they do highlight the importance of the experiences that we provide for young people to learn about themselves and develop key life skills such as resilience and being able to work effectively as part of a team.

The EBGC staff and volunteers involved in residential work will all have similar stories of when young people have found it tough at the start of weeks away and after a couple of days of climbing up and down the mountains or similar young people will often tell me that they are done! Yet somehow they keep going and by the end of the week can reflect back on how far they have come and what they have achieved. When you have moments like this you realise how important it is to keep providing these opportunities in the future.

A big thank you to Ollie, Elliott, Paul, Rich and all the other staff that support programmes based here in Wales for their efforts in making 2023 a success. Also a special mention and thank you to the Rank Foundation who have supported Rich as part of the Rank Aspire Programme that he began with us in Autumn.

We look forward to welcoming many of you back again in 2024!

An update from Layer Marney outdoors

This year we focused on increasing the range of activities we can deliver both on and off site. On site, we have reintroduced the Crate Stack activity, got the mobile climbing wall up and running, and collaborated with the Tower team to include self-guided tours and pizza making to the range of activities we have to offer. We have delivered activity days for children and adults at several venues across Essex including Mersea Boating Lake, Debden House, Saffron Walden MOD site, and Sir John Heron Primary School as well as other schools participating in Respect Projects. We have delivered training days for staff to refresh and upskill to deliver a more varied range of activities on a theme, such as the Water Day and Night Exercise events. We have also offered activities to a winder range of clientele such as schools with alternative provision for behaviour and SEND young people, birthday party sessions for younger children and the occasional adult.

In 2024, we have several 'Have a go days' scheduled for staff and volunteers to learn about the new activities we offer and develop their skill towards supporting and delivering on busy days. We are focusing on increasing awareness of what we offer, building our contacts list and developing working relationships with regular groups.

TREASURER'S REPORT - Graham Middleton

It is fair to say that, after the disruption caused by the Covid Pandemic followed by a period of inflation and national economic and political uncertainty, Charities income would eventually suffer. In fact, it continues to be funding originating from central government that has reduced, with the National Citizen Scheme impacting the most. However, we had been expecting this to happen and the strength of our reserves enables us to be sure of continuing our core programs with on-going vigour. The current year will see a long-term project funded by the Big Lottery come to a successful conclusion, again, we are working hard to replace this income, and have the reserves to negate any possible adversity along the way. This puts us in a very strong position to deliver on bids for funding streams and I am sure this is appreciated by benefactors seeking good value for their financial support. We exist to create life-changing and affirming opportunities for young people and as this brochure illustrates, we are certainly doing just that. This Charity remains very grateful to all those benefactors whose belief in our ability to make good things happen to young people moves them to provide the funds that make it possible.

Despite incoming resources falling some 7.4% to £1,380,492, we were able to grow our overall funds by a modest £23,781, this after a small increase in expenditure on delivering our charitable activities. The increase in net incoming resources was considerably boosted by an unrealised gain in the value of our invested core reserves and this helps to preserve the purchasing power of these reserves.

We carry forward into 2024 funds totalling £3,628,975 compared to £3,419,311 at the end of 2022. Of this total, we increased funding for future restricted projects by £103,814 to £592,083 and increased reserves for funding designate activities by £19,371 to £1,706,590. Our core unrestricted reserves were able to absorb an excess of expenditure over income of £107,584 leaving a net asset base of £1,330,302 as a resounding foundation for future development.

Abbreviated accounts are published here, a full audited set including the Trustees report is available on application to Harway House and will be filed with the Charities Commission.
